

Ginger Crossbody Bag Supply List

Important: If you plan to order supplies from Sallie Tomato, wait until you receive the June discount code for 20% off. The code will be sent to workshop registrants beginning in late May 2025.

Sewing machine, foot pedal, power cord, new 90/14 needle*
(If you are a beginner, bring your machine manual too.)

Presser feet:

Standard

¼ inch

Zipper foot

Sallie Tomato Ginger pattern

Fabric as listed

¼ yard main fabric (flap, top panel, strap connectors)

⅜ yard contrast fabric (straps, facing, bottom panel) – if using cork fabric that is 25 in. wide, ½ yard is needed

½ yard lining fabric (lining and inside pocket)

1 yard fusible woven interfacing (only ½ yard needed if using cork fabric for contrast)

Fusible fleece or sew-in foam: ½ yard if 28 inch wide OR ⅜ yard if 45 inch wide

Sallie Tomato ¾ inch Style 4 basic hardware kit (several color options available)

10 inch size #5 single slide zipper (*I prefer S.T. faux metal!*)

Matching or coordinating thread

Optional: Large turn lock (50mm) OR Crystal turn lock to use instead of magnetic snap (I recommend this upgrade!)



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Helpful notions: Sewing clips or pins, Marking tool (chalk or removable pen), Sewist's wand or stiletto, Seam gauge, Scissors, Thread snips, Seam Ripper (but we'll hope we won't need to use it!)

Prior to class:

- Cut out all pattern pieces according to the directions, both the measure and cut pieces listed on page 1 of the instructions as well as the pieces on pages 7-12. (I always photocopy the pages with pattern pieces or trace them onto tissue paper rather than using the original.)
- Fuse interfacing to all main fabric and contrast fabric pieces **except do not** interface the strap pieces. (If you are using cork fabric for the contrast, you will not interface those pieces.)
- If you are using a fusible fleece, fuse the fleece to the pieces listed on page 1. If you chose sew-in foam, we can attach that as the first step in class.

*For this bag, I would recommend a Microtex or Sharps needle, size 90/14, or a universal needle size 90/14 or 100/16 if you chose the foam.
